Dear Resident

The King Georges Road Interchange is being upgraded to reduce local congestion and improve access to the M5 corridor. Work involves widening and extending the eastbound on-ramp and westbound off-ramp between King Georges Road and the M5 East.

### Earth works near Kirrang Street south

As part of the upgrade, earth works will be carried out near Kirrang Street south, Beverly Hills to provide extra capacity on the westbound motorway off ramp. Once the works are complete, a new noise wall will be constructed.

The earth works will commence Monday 28 September 2015 and take approximately two months to complete. Work will be carried out during standard construction hours from 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, and on Saturdays from 8am to 1pm, weather permitting.

Trucks will be used to remove the excavated soil from the site. Some of the soil to be excavated is known to contain low levels of bonded asbestos.

**Note:** Low level bonded asbestos includes material such as fibro where the asbestos fibres are bonded to cement, resin or other materials. If asbestos fibres are in a stable material such as bonded in asbestos-cement sheeting like fibro and in good condition they pose little health risk.\*

Removal of any material containing asbestos will be carried out by an experienced contractor licenced by WorkCover to remove asbestos. Information on asbestos removal is also available on the WorkCover NSW website.

Work to remove the soil containing the bonded asbestos will commence Monday 28 September 2015 and take approximately two weeks to complete, weather permitting. The following safety procedures will apply:

- Air quality will be continuously monitored,
- Signs, barriers and temporary fencing will be installed around areas containing asbestos,
- Water spray will be applied to suppress dust,
- Material containing asbestos will be handled by specially trained personnel who will dispose of the material at licensed facilities,
- Trucks carrying material containing asbestos will be covered and checked before leaving the site,
- Independent inspections of the site will be undertaken and the asbestos will be tracked from the site to the receiving facility.
